Today we are going to visit
Innisfallen Island. The boat
takes 15 minutes to get to the
island and you will then have
30 minutes to explore the
monastery and the woodland
nature trail.

An Cathal is a very special boat.
It has a stairs, is wheelchair
accessible and carries a sensory
box in the bow (the front!!)











Innisfallen Island is 1.5 km away. It is home to one of Ireland's oldest church settlements (late 6th / early 7th century).

The ruins on the island are from the 12th Century. The island was a school a long time ago and the most famous student was Brian Boru.

Did you know there was a book written on Innisfallen? It is called the 'Annals of Innisfallen' and contains the history of Ireland over 300 years.

Keep a look out for wildlife when on the lake and on the island. You can see deer, otters, swans, ducks, eagles, waterhen and lots more.

Make sure to tell the skipper if you see something!

On the island there are lots of deer. They are really friendly and love having their photo taken.

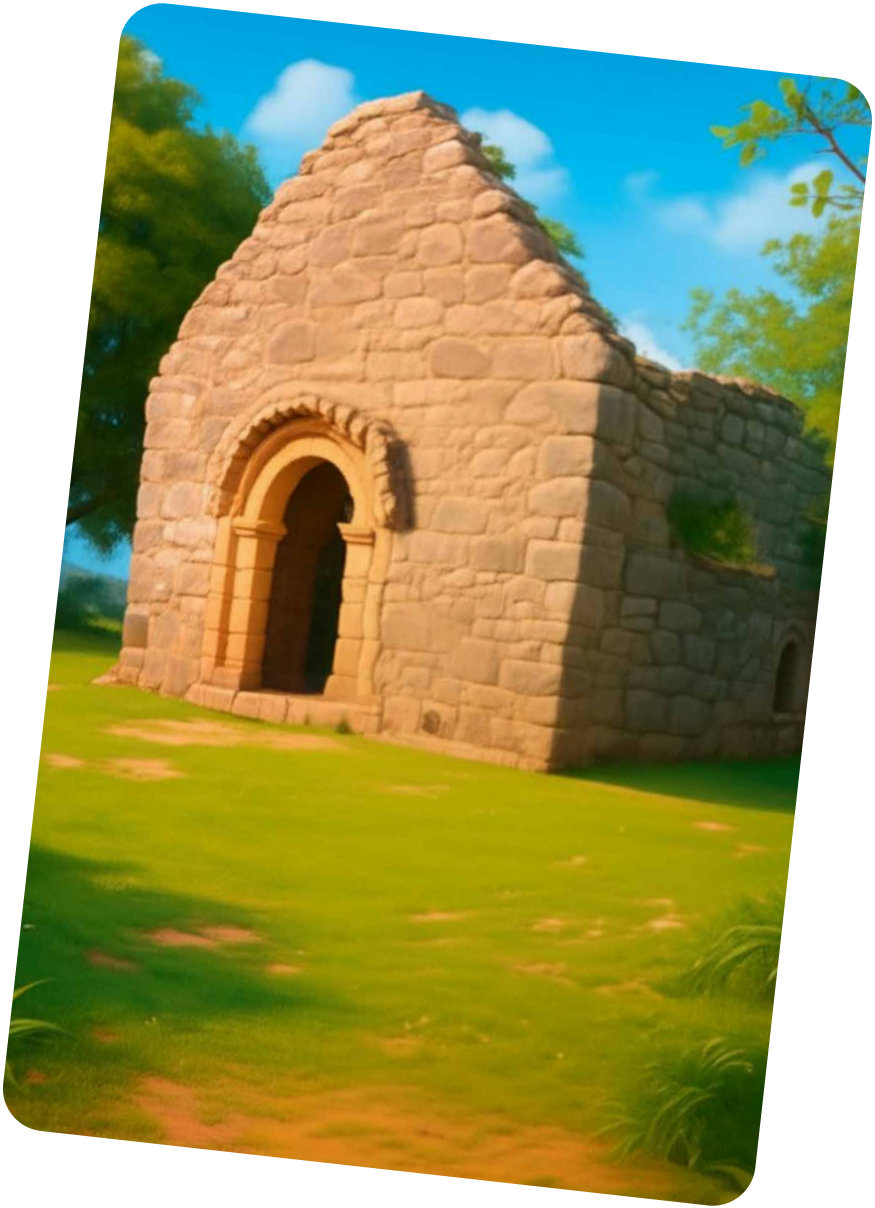

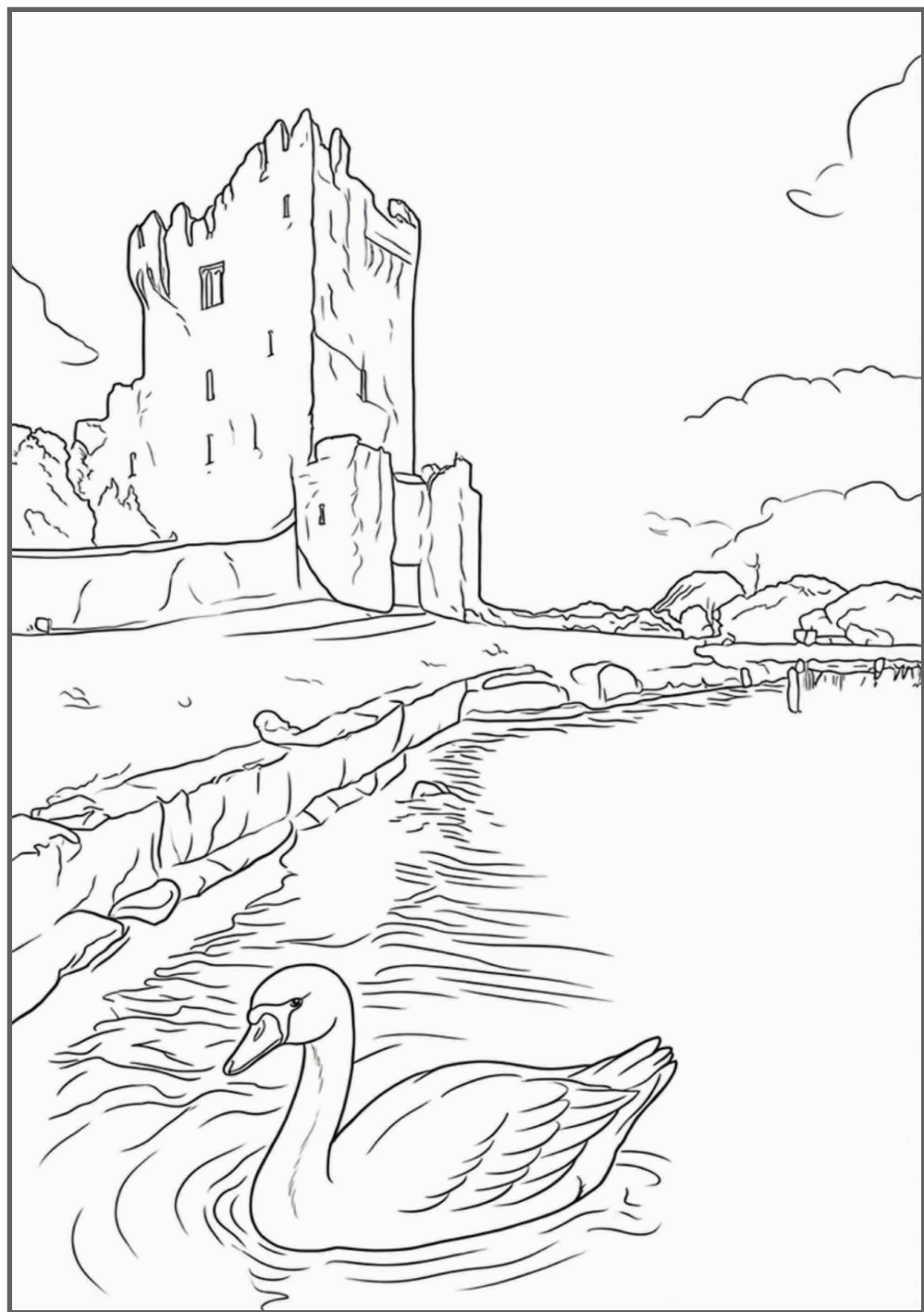
